Shifting the focus





Traditional ApproachFocused mainly on inputs
and activities

Result-Based Approach

Focus on the results rather just on the inputs used or activities conducted





Result-based approach

- WHAT? Links between outputs and results/strategic objectives
- WHY? Reaching programme objectives (result indicators)
- HOW? Intervention logic of the project (clear definition of results and measurable indicators)





Cross-border character



- Deliver clear cross-border cooperation impact and benefit
- Demonstrate added value to Union strategies and programmes

Indicative list of supported actions (TO1)



Cooperation between science parks, educational institutions, industrial parks, SMEs and public sector institutions (triple-helix cooperation) in order to foster innovation and modernisation



The development of cross-border business contacts and services-products (contact-meetings, fairs, and joint product development and marketing, including local/regional tourism products and services such as tourism routes)



Support for the development of the creative industry and cultural tourism



Educational programmes for launching start-ups



Promoting entrepreneurship (startups or enterprise schools)



Support services and infrastructure such as industrial parks, incubators, and clusters



Local/regional tourism objects and routes





Indicative list of supported actions (TO5)

Education - cooperation between (vocational) schools in fields such as teaching methodology (including Russian language) and the development of curricula

Health - active life and recreation, rehabilitation

Social - youth services, employment, HIV/AIDS prevention

Culture – the preservation and promotion of cultural and historical heritage on a municipal level

Sport – an exchange of know-how and contacts



 Joint actions for improving rescue fire services and protecting forests Reconstruction of waste water treatment plants










Partnership requirement

> At least 2 partners



> At least one partner from Estonia a Russia

> Associated partners





Eligible partners I

Have to be established and have their legal address in the Programme area





National, regional and local public authorities

Associations that are formed by one or more national, regional or local authorities

Public equivalent bodies





Eligible partners II

Other bodies that are governed by public legal acts (museums, municipal and national enterprises, trade unions, medical institutions)

Associations of previously mentioned bodies

Educational organisations

NGOs and other non-profit-making bodies

SMEs (participation is allowed only under TO1)

SMEs cannot act as Applicant (Lead beneficiary)



SMEs cannot act as the only partner from the participating country





Partners

Partners form adjoining area - Põhja-Eesti (including Tallinn) can participate in the projects under TO1 and TO6







Associated partners

Can be involved if they play a real role in the project



Do not have to meet the eligibility criteria referred to in point 4 of the Guidelines


